

Ideas for Running Record Series Use at Universities

Class also learns analysis from the PIAT CD as a group completing the first part of the workbook together. After initial training, students independently complete PIAT workbook to demonstrate their analysis abilities. Students also independently work through SP and turn in workbooks as documentation of their ability to accurately take and analyze running records.
Involved	PIAT workbook and SP workbook	\$31	Professor teaches running record conventions and their analysis using CMS and PIAT CDs in class. Students must do PIAT analysis in workbook for experience, stories to be analyzed may be spread out throughout the semester. Class listens to the SP CD together; but students complete individual workbooks and turn them in as documentation of their ability to accurately take and analyze running records.
Extensive	SP workbook	\$11	Professor teaches running record conventions and analysis using CMS and PIAT CDs in class. Students take notes on CMS and PIAT information. Class listens to the SP CD together. Students complete workbooks and turn them in as documentation of their ability to accurately take running records.
